A maximum of 9 Trustees can be appointed. Trustees are appointed for a period of 3 years. The constitution states that Wem Town Council may appoint up to three trustees. Two trustee were appointed in the year 2024-25, and as at 31 March 2025 there were 2 trustee vacancies.

Wem Town Council provide secretariat and treasurers services for the Association which is undertaken by the Town Clerk. Wem Town Council's Grounsmanis based at the Butler Sports Centre and is responsible for maintaining the Butler Sports Centre football pitches and Wem Recreation Ground.

The Charity's Custodian Trustee is The Official Custodian of Charities.

Trustee met 5 times over the year. Minutesand agendas are published on the Town Council website

3. Activities and Achievements

3.1 Activities during the year

Wem Sports and Social Association CIO is responsible for the maintenance of the Butler Sports Centre which provides changing rooms, football stadium with seating and floodlighting. It also manages Wem Recreation Ground which incorporates the bowling green and tennis courts.

Wem Recreation Ground -a lease is in place with The Albion Bowling Clubto run the bowling club on Wem Recreation Ground. Wem Tennis Club manage 2 tennis courts and the clubhouse on Wem Recreation Ground, altough a formal land use agreement is not currently in place for the Tennis Club, this is to be progressed in 2025-26.

The recrecation ground was hired out for Wem Fest, a family music festival run by Wem Rotary, and Wrights Fair hired the facility on two accasions for fairs during the year.

Butler Sports Centre - a 5 year lease was signed with Wem Town FC in December 2023 for part of the space occupied by the former social club. Other land at the Butler Sports Centre is occupied by Wem Bowling Club who independently manage a clubhouseand two bowling greens on the site. A formal land use agreement is not currently in place with the bowling club and this is to be progressed in 2025-26. During 2024-25 the football pitches were hired by Shropshire Schools Under 16 and Under 14 girls, and U16 and Under 14 boys teams for regular games

A sellout prepurchase ticket only fireworks night was organised by The Association on 5 November 2024

For the first time time trustees organised a Sports Person of the Year Award and this helped to raise the profile of the Association without any impact on the budget due to outside sponsorship supporting the event

Income

Wem Town Council continued its contribution in 2024-25 of £21000 towards the running of the Associatio and the purchase of ground maintenance equipment.

The Butler Sports Centre is primarily used as the home ground for Wem Town Football Club, and is also avaiable to rent. During the year the facilities have also been hired for Shropshire Schools games and Powel cup games, bringing in additional hire income.

The facility was also hired out for one off events including Wem Carnival, Wem 10K and Fireworks.

Income from the hire of Wem Recreation Ground has exceeded budget due to additional hires from Wem Rotary and Wrights Fair.

Some of the profit from the firewoks event was used to purchase radios and remove part of the fencing around the old 5 aside court, along with part of the hedge to open up the space and make it more usable as hardstanding throughout the year. A balance of £2500 has been placed in earmarked reserves for the purchase of signage and any additional infrastructure required for future fireworks.

Expenditure

No significant maintenance was undertaken on the facility during 2024-25, which helped offset the rise in utility and general maintenance costs.

Machinery costs were also less than the previous year, as there was no significant expenditure on new equipment. £7000 from thr Town Council's contribution was transferred to earmarked reserves for future equipment purchases.

3.2 Summary of Income and Expenditure

The cost of maintaining the sports field and the various other areas for which the maintenance is delegated to the Association amounted to £8,923 before the depreciation charge totalling £7,384. Depreciation being a provision for future capital expenditure or replacement of the facilities.

Total Income from all sources was £49,512. For the year total Income exceeded Expenditure by £14,634.

Although the Association has sufficient resources to meet its day to date operations, it is highly dependent on the grant from Wem Town Council to cover costs. Any major expenditure will place a strain on the cash flow. Over the last 2 years reserves have risen by £9,867.

3.3 Summary and Acknowledgements

The Association has not sought to accumulate funds for any specific future projects and it is considered that funds are adequate to cover any reasonable emergency. The expenditure on the maintenance and improvement of the facilities is restricted by the funds available or to put it another way, what members and the Town Council are prepared to finance and by what grant aid is available. Providing that the full support and financial backing of Wem Town Council continues and that any expenditure on the facilities is restricted to the amount of funds available, the overall financial position is considered sound.

4. Policies

The policies are as follows:

- to keep the standard of the facilities under the constant review and to restrict expenditure to within the level of funds available (see above)
- to use funds received from the former Social Club's contributions, to fund extraordinary expenditure on the changing rooms.
 - * to keep all funds fairly liquid and easily accessible.

Against this background it is considered that there are no major risks to which the charity is exposed.

5. Statement of Trustees' responsibilities

Charity Law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial yearwhich show a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and its financial activities for the period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- * select suitable accounting policies and the apply them consistently
- * Make judgements and estimates that are reasinale and prudent
- * state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- * prepare the financial statements on going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Charity will continue in operational existence.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
