Wem Area Climate Change Action Plan

The Need

Wem Town Council declared a 'Climate Emergency' at its meeting held on 25th April 2019.

The key aims of the action plan are as follows:

- To help move towards Wem and surrounding area being a net-zero carbon producer by 2030 but ideally as soon as possible;
- To increase local resilience to climate impacts;
- To maximise local benefits of these actions in other sectors such as health, agriculture, transport and the economy;
- To request that the UK Government provide the support and resources to make this possible;
- Work with other organisations, such as Wem Economic Forum, Neighbouring Councils and local businesses and organisations to raise awareness and help counter climate change;

Outlined below is a number of suggested actions that can be taken on by the Town Council and wider community that will help to achieve the carbon neutral status

It is suggested that once adopted the plan is monitored every 3 months to ensure it is up to date and relevant.
