# Notes to accompany 2026-27 draft Amenities Budget

# Introduction

It is essential that the Town Council continues to invest in the upkeep and improvement of the assets it owns. Outlined below are some recommendations for improvements to enhance the facilities offered by the Town Council. These do inevitably come at a cost, and this is reflected in the increase in the recreation budget for 2026-27

Allotments	An above inflationary increase to the water budget due to the amount of water being used following dryer summers. An inflationary increase to the repair budget.

Recreation WSSA	WSSA Trustees request that this contribution is increased by the rate of inflation (3.5%) to £21,735 for 2025-26 with £7,245 of this amount being earmarked for future machinery purchases (see separate report).
Play Equipment	Minute 102/25 deferred to the finance committee to make provision in the 2026–27 budget for a pendulum swing, subject to costings and site confirmation.
	If the Council wants to make provision for this item in the budget, £20,000 will be needed. Indicative quotes show a pendulum swing will cost between £14,000 and £16,000. The current Neighbourhood Fund balance (as at 30.11.25) is £11,796, and the allocation for 2026–27 is not yet known.
Repairs and Maintenance	Increase to £8,000 for repairs to wetpour on play equipment in The Grove and Lowe Hill Gardens and a replacement bearing on oyster dish at a cost of £3000.

## **Neighbourhood Fund**

Amenities and Services Income — It is difficult to predict income levels. Income from allotment rents has been increased to reflect the fact that there are now more quarter plots. Burial fees income is unchanged, and toilet income is estimated to reduce. Full Council will consider charges for cemetery and allotment fees at the January Budget meeting.

### **Administration Budget**

There are no significant changes or additions to the Administration Budget apart from the following:

All other codes have been increased by 3.5% to allow for inflation.

#### **Administration Income**

Income from bank interest has been reduced to £15,000 as interest rates have reduced regularly throughout 2025-26.
