Mayor's Report

The Past Mayor of Wem, Cllr Peter Broomhall gives an overview of his term of office

It was a great honour to be elected the Mayor of Wem for 2021-2022. The year started very calmly due to COVID! Meetings meant we needed to stay 2 metres apart and needing to wear masks. I attended numerous social events throughout the year. Unfortunately - no Wem Carnival - for me to lead the parade.

June gave us the 'Armed Forces Day' celebrated on the Church Green at the Parish Church. My Civic Service was themed with Harvest Festival, all townspeople were invited to attend and many came back to Wem Town Hall for tea and cake.

Remembrance Day was celebrated at the memorial, Wem Parish Church and although we were unable to hold a service inside the church, a large crowd gathered and joined in with the outdoor service.

I held my Mayor's Ball in Wem Town Hall (thanks go to all staff and volunteers for their help to make it such a successful evening and those who generously gave towards my Charity fund). Thank you to Wem Methodist Church for donating proceeds from a coffee morning. Also thanks go to Kerry Edge at Maypole Court Bistro for organising and contributing towards a Cheese, Pate and Wine evening a pleasant time was had by all that attended. All these events contributed to me raising the sum of £3,400 for Alzheimer's Society. Thank you so much to all the Wem Town Councillors for their help and support throughout my year. And a big thank you to Penny O'Hagan, Sue Thornhill, Mandy Robert's and John (our groundsman) for all their hard work in Wem (Where Everyone Matters). Finally I would like to wish Geoff Soul, our new Mayor, every success in the forthcoming year.

Wem Town Council meets on the last Thursday of every month except August and December at Edinburgh House, New Street, Wem, at 7pm.

The Council always welcomes electors' comments and suggestions and allows time at the start of each monthly meeting for questions from residents of the town wishing to attend.

THE COUNCIL'S YEAR

This was another year where the council had to work through the challenges of Covid 19 and the complex rules around the lifting of restrictions.

Covid support

Town Council staff and Councillors once again worked in partnership with Wem Store Cupboard to provide food parcels for those in need.

The group has worked closely with the schools to specifically support families during holiday periods and has developed a regular monthly free lunch for anyone wishing to reconnect with old friends or meet new people. These free lunches are held in St Peters Church Hall on a Saturday and the date is advertised on noticeboards and on Social Media.

Community Car Project

In 2021 the Town Council was asked to consider taking on the co-ordination of the community car scheme as the existing co-ordinator decided it was time to retire and there was no one who felt able to take over the role. Community Cars provides an essential service for those in the community who need to attend medical appointments or require transport for visits to the shops etc. After a 3 month trial period the Town Council agreed to take on the role permanently and over the last months staff have worked with customers to match them with a volunteer car driver. We are always on the look out for new drivers so if you are interested please contact the Town Council – mileage is paid to cover driver expenses.

Events

Like 2020 the majority of events in the town were cancelled. However, the Town Council with the help of the Royal British Legion Wem Branch managed to hold the traditional Act of Remembrance in November. The Christmas lights festival was well supported by the community and it was wonderful to see it return.

Welcome Back Fund

The Town Council was lucky to receive a small grant from the Government to support town centres. This grant funding was used for the following enhancement works

- Purchase of gazebos to be used at events and the weekly market
- Purchase of a new events noticeboard on the Jubilee square
- Repainting of bins, bollards and benches
- Commissioning enhanced cleaning of High Street and Drawwell Walk
- Purchase of Christmas lights for the trees on Leek Street

Planning

Shropshire Council's Local Plan Review continued and the Town Council was consulted on its opinion on the sites in the town put forward for development. The Town Council's strongly worded response was that it could not support any future development sites in the town until improvements are made to long standing issues including improvements to the highways network. The Council is awaiting the outcome of the review which will be decided in the Autumn / Winter of 2022/3.

2021 Elections

In May 2021 a new electoral term started. No elections were held in either Wem ward as insufficient candidates stood for election. Pauline Dee and Chris Mellings, two stalwarts of the Town Council decided not to stand for re-election and to recognise their significant contribution to the town over several decades the Town Council were delighted to award them Honorary Townsman status.

Staff Changes

The Town Council were delighted to appoint Mandy Roberts as our new Project and Finance Assistant. Mandy spent a large part of the year working with the committee who were planning the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. She also oversaw a project to donate 70 free trees to residents to mark the Jubilee.
